Create a course portfolio that contains work you have done throughout the semester for this course. Your portfolio at the minimum should contain items 1 through 4 from the list below plus any additional work that you feel especially proud of. Work that you believe illustrate your understanding of a concept or problems that you found to be particularly interesting or challenging would be good choices.

Here is some information about portfolios:

1. Portfolios must be returned at most 48 hours after the final exam for overall grading. All graded work including the final exam and assignments should be included in the portfolio.

2. Place your work and supporting materials in order inside a 3 ring binder. After cover page add an Index page, then a table listing all you work and the grade you received in it, followed another table listing all the videos you have posted to the group Facebook page by the last day of classes. It needs to have the title and link of each video included. Then add a self-assessment essay and then the work in order.

3. Portfolio Self-Assessment essay: Each portfolio should have a self-assessment essay in which you can argue your case that contrary to your class performance, you deserve a specific grade and then argue your case. This is you trying to convince the instructor why you should be given a grade. Make sure to understand that your grade in the class is not identified by your desire to get a grade. It is based on your performance. But you can argue your case which may improve your homework 10 grade.

4. For each homework and exam write a separate assessment/reflection on the that homework or exam.

- Write about the mistakes, misunderstandings, and other reasons for which you may have lost points. If you did well in one of them, you might want to reflect why you did well in that one. Remember, it is your reflection and thus any explanation is fine as long as you feel that was the main reason for not getting full grade on a work. Here is the sample of previous comments students have written over the years:

- * instructor did not like me
- * homework was too difficult
- * I made one little mistake and I got an unfair deduction from the grade
- * I knew everything but I got excited during the test and made mistakes

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- * I came late to the test and instructor did not give me additional time
- * instructor did not let us use our computer or programmable calculators
- * I did not know the materials well enough

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5. Some of the additional work you have done to enhance your knowledge (whether assigned by the instructor or by your own initiative). Please remember that your portfolio is a final reflection on your experiences in the course, so you should take the initiative to make it meaningful. A description of why you chose each item and an explanation of the thinking process involved is very helpful.

6. If you have lost any of your work, make sure to include its grade in the table after the Index page. You can ask me about your grade in lost homework assignments.
